StepOne is the first *proactive* decon product for the fire service.

1
Apply

One time at the *beginning* of your shift, apply **StepOne** to your forearms, lower legs, and neck. **StepOne** dries quickly to form a light film.

2
Forget

Proceed with your shift like usual; no further action is required. **StepOne** lasts for a full **24-hour** shift and is water- and abrasion-resistant.

3
Fight

During firefighting, **StepOne** delays carcinogen absorption into the skin, allowing the carcinogens to be removed later by skin wipes and showers.

4
Decon

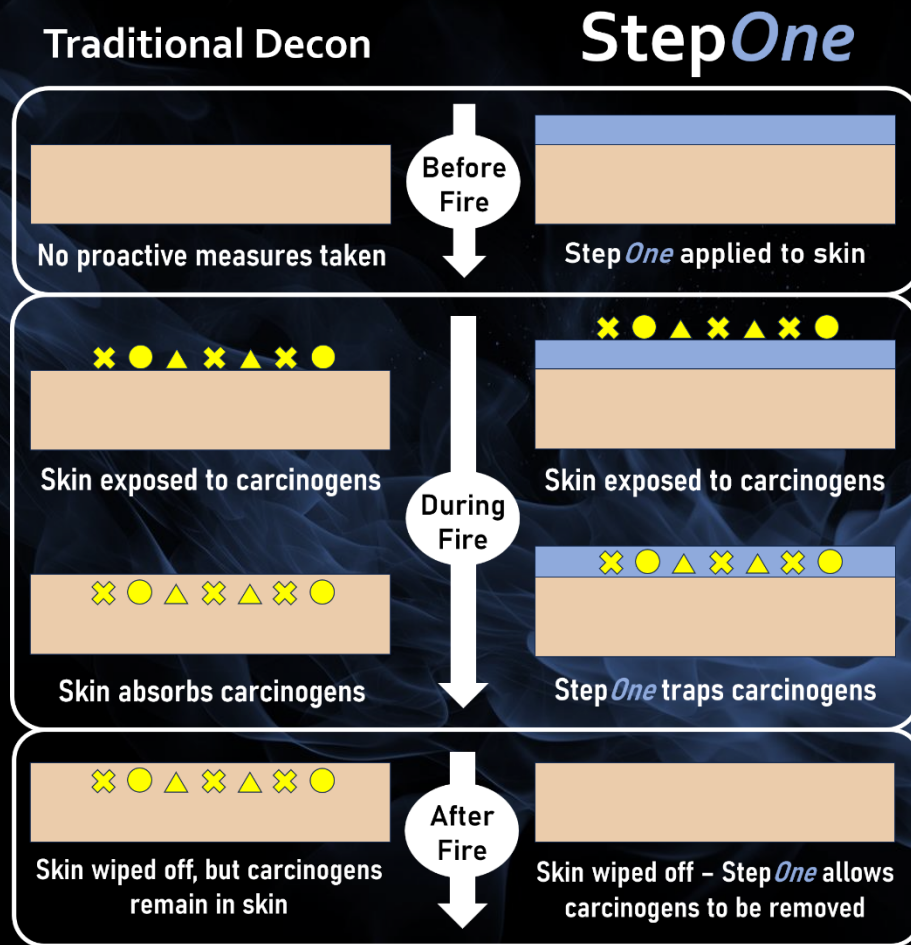
After a fire, perform decon like usual. By keeping carcinogens on the surface of the skin, **StepOne** improves dermal decon effectiveness by **10x**.

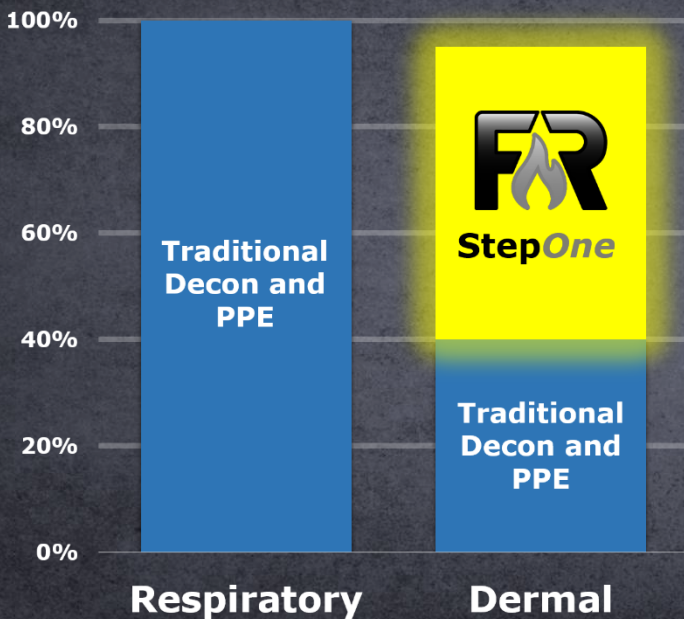

FAQs

Why is StepOne applied specifically to the forearms, lower legs, and neck?

- Carcinogen-containing smoke penetrates your gear at interfaces—between boots and trousers, gloves and coat, coat and hood, etc. Thus, the forearms, lower legs, and neck are the most exposed parts of the body.

How long is StepOne effective after application?

- For 24 hours, or until you perform decon. StepOne is designed to form a sacrificial film, so the product should be reapplied after decon.

Which carcinogens is StepOne effective against?

- StepOne has been proven effective against PAHs, specifically benzo[a]pyrene, which is the primary dermally-absorbed carcinogen for firefighters according to the International Agency for Research on Cancer (Monograph 132).

Can I apply aloe gel or lotion over top of StepOne?

- Aloe yes, lotion no. Aloe gel can be applied without issue and will have the same cooling effects as on bare skin. Lotion, however, needs to directly contact the skin to be effective, and StepOne will block this from happening.

Is StepOne compatible with sunscreen?

- Yes, but use a sunscreen spray, not a lotion. Sunscreen lotions often contain extra ingredients that disrupt the StepOne film. Sunscreen sprays do not contain these extra ingredients.

Is StepOne flammable?

- No, StepOne is completely non-flammable.

Does StepOne expire?

- StepOne is good for two years from the date of sale.
